<p>The "Seminar 1: Unemployed Active Citizenship: Time for Activation!" took place on April 23-24, 2024, at the Social Innovation and Cohesion Institute - Fifty-Fifty, located at Proxenou Koromila str. 51, 1st floor, Thessaloniki, Greece. This seminar aimed to delve into the role of active citizenship among the unemployed and explore strategies to foster engagement and innovation in this area.</p>	

The seminar began on April 23 with participant registrations from 10:00 to 10:30. The opening session from 10:30 to 11:00 featured greetings from project leaders and short presentations by the participating organizations. Welcome speeches set a collaborative tone for the event.

From 11:00 to 12:00, the introductory seminar session focused on understanding unemployed active citizenship, emphasizing the importance of intercultural dialogue and the exchange of knowledge and experiences. This session provided a foundational understanding of the seminar's themes and objectives.

After a coffee break from 12:00 to 12:30, the seminar continued with Session 2 from 12:30 to 13:30, which explored the intersection between unemployment and active citizenship. This session aimed to identify how active citizenship can be a catalyst for addressing unemployment issues.

Following a lunch break from 13:30 to 15:30, participants engaged in a group exercise from 15:30 to 16:30 to identify barriers to active citizenship. This interactive team-building activity encouraged participants to analyze and identify barriers to active citizenship in the context of unemployment, fostering collaborative problem-solving.

The day concluded with a recap and evaluation session from 17:30 to 18:00, summarizing the day's discussions and key takeaways, and making announcements for the next day's agenda. A dinner featuring traditional Greek dishes at 19:30 provided a cultural experience and further networking opportunities.

On April 24, the second day began with a recap of Day 1 and an overview of Day 2 from 10:00 to 10:30. This was followed by a group laboratory activity from 10:30 to 10:45 focused on design thinking for innovative solutions, setting the stage for creative problem-solving throughout the day.

From 10:45 to 12:00, Seminar Session 4 analyzed unemployment trends and strategies for sustainable active citizenship initiatives. This session aimed to provide participants with an understanding of current trends and long-term strategies to address unemployment through active citizenship.

After a coffee break from 12:00 to 12:30, Seminar Session 5 took place from 12:30 to 13:30, exploring the role of technology in promoting active citizenship and innovative solutions for addressing unemployment challenges. This session highlighted the importance of digital tools and platforms in modern civic engagement.

From 13:30 to 14:30, a laboratory team workshop focused on leveraging technology for social impact. This guided group activity emphasized understanding policy advocacy tools and techniques for influencing legislative change to address unemployment issues.

Following a lunch break from 14:30 to 15:30, the seminar concluded with an evaluation of Day 2 and a closing ceremony from 15:30 to 16:00. This session provided a final opportunity to reflect on the seminar's outcomes, gather feedback, and celebrate the collaborative efforts of the participants.

Throughout the seminar, participants engaged in meaningful discussions, collaborative activities, and cultural exchanges, fostering a comprehensive understanding of active citizenship's role in addressing unemployment within the European Union context.
